Treats Only: Apples, carrots and store bought horse treats from a horse tack store.

2. Cool Down Your Horse: Make sure your horse is completely cooled down before feeding treats.

3. Feed After Your Lesson: It's a reward, not a bribe!

4. Feed In Feeders: Not with your fingers!

5. Less is More: Don't over feed, give affection instead!
